(a) **Research**

Eva Burrows College is committed to the research goals of the University of Divinity and has expressed this commitment in a number of significant ways. Associate Professor Glen O'Brien was appointed in January 2018 to the full time role of Research Coordinator and he is currently serving a three year term as Chair of the Research Committee of the University of Divinity. The College presently has four students enrolled in the PhD award including one student who is a Gender Equity Researcher fully funded by a partnership between The Salvation Army and the University of Divinity. Another PhD candidate won the prestigious Leatherland Prize for excellence in liturgical theology. EBC students have successfully undertaken numerous 12,000 word research essays in both the Sydney College of Divinity and University of Divinity and several are currently enrolled in the UD's Graduate Certificate in Research Methodology. The research culture of EBC is on an upward swing and the prospects for solid research outcomes are positive with staff currently working on several publishing projects. Dr Arseny Ermakov has just completed a commentary on Matthew and is currently in Manchester as a visiting researcher at the Nazarene Theological College. Major David Janssen is in the final stages of his doctoral thesis in New Testament studies and Associate Professor Glen O'Brien has a monograph on John Wesley's social and political tracts in peer review with T & T Clark. Our first Research Seminar was held on the 10 May with five presentations highlighting the research activity of our staff. A second is planned for October 2019.
